\$80K damages awarded

Lawyer satisfied with results of case

A White Rock man has been awarded \$80,000 in damages for injuries suffered in a collision three years ago.

Travis Lowen was a passenger in a 1989 Honda that was rearended by a four-door Chevrolet Feb. 17, 2003, on 176 Street, just south of the Highway 10 overpass.

Honda driver Riley Bourassa had slowed to turn left off 176 Street when the southbound car was hit from behind.

The impact propelled the Honda 80 feet, and destroyed the Chevrolet.

Westminster Supreme Court, Justice J. Truscott agreed the collision left Lowen – 19 at the time of the accident – with "lower back pain that may not resolve and at risk for degenerative changes and other problems as his spine ages."

He awarded Lowen \$40,000 in non-pecuniary damages,

\$2,332.40 for loss of income, \$40,000 for loss of earning capacity, plus costs.

Craig Moulton, Lowen's lawyer, said Friday he's "very satisfied" with the outcome.

"It was worthwhile letting the judge decide," he said.
